Tommy Jenkins of the Macon County Economic Development Commission (MCEDC) introduced Dale McGiboney, CEO of Highland Mediaworks (HM). McGiboney made a presentation of it's newest project, a video kiosk to be located at the Macon County Airport (MCA). The first phase of this project should be completed in February.





HM has solicited sponsors who will appear on this video and talk about all of the great things that are available here in Macon County. The video will be divided into many different segments, such as Activities, Culinary, Lodging, Shopping, Golf, Real Estate, Arts and Culture, Education,

Health and Wellness, and several other topics. Visitors arriving at MCA can use a touch screen that will then open up to any of these segments.

Also, this video can be played online so that many business owners can merge a specific segment into their own business website. HM is doing this project in collaboration with MCEDC.
