


Dr. Davids introduced Lorraine Johnson, Director of Mountain Mediation Services(MMS) and Adele Doering, volunteer mediator at MMS. MMS has 3 offices in 7 counties in western North Carolina. It provides mediation services to the local community and in doing so, it helps alleviate the backlog of disputes that are in the local court system. Most of the cases that they handle

come from the courts, whereby one person has filed a complaint or a warrant against another person. Examples are landlord/tenant disputes or neighbor disputes. MMS brings both parties together and attempts to get them to

resolve their problem outside of court. The MMS mediator does not take sides but allows each party to talk in front of the other party in a civilized manner.

MMS also provides Mediation training and is always looking for volunteer mediators. It recently finished training 1,400 students in bullying education




Connect NC Bond
