Macon County Airport

Gary Shields introduced Miles Gregory, Chairman of the Macon County Airport Authority, as a native of Macon County. Mr. Gregory served eight years as a Macon County Commissioner and as Chairman for four years. Miles was the first County Commissioner elected as the president of the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners west of Buncombe County. He has also served as president of the Franklin Chamber of Commerce and as Chairman of the local Government Advisory Council made up of mayors and county commission-


ers across the State. Miles Gregory has served on the Macon County Airport Authority since its inception until the present and has been the Chairman for the last twelve years.



Miles said that with all his service to Macon County over the years this is his first time at the Franklin Rotary Club. He said as a native of Macon County it was his desire to create opportunities for the residents of the County and to make a difference for the youth


growing up here. Miles said that the Macon County Airport Authority was setup by the legislature and has a five member board. The 97 acres that make up the airport was deeded to the Airport Authority. The goal of the Airport Authority Board was to make it a creditable airport which has hap-

pened over the years in operation. When the Board elected to extend the runway by a thousand feet their was some local opposition that had to be overcome. That runway extension increased the annual usage at the airport.





businesses; the weather station housed at the airport; lighted runway; flight instructions and ground school. With the extended runway the jet traffic at the airport has picked up. There are 31 airplanes parked at the airport: 25 single engine, I turbo, I twin engine, I jet and 3 medical helicopters. Miles indicated the airport is a tremendous asset for Macon County especially for industrial development. A couple of the local businesses use the airport facilities almost daily. He stated that the economic impact based on a UNC study showed 40 jobs related to the airport, a \$750,00 payroll and a \$4.9 Million annual economic impact on the local economy. Miles stated that the traffic at the airport and picked up 20% last year and there is a great demand for hangar space. The Airport Authority has had numerous visits with the Cherokees to promote the airport usage and that the Authority has been master planning future improvements at the airport.

Stop Hunger Now April 2nd!





Those requested items include....


