The final report for Rotary year 2015 – 16 has been submitted and we are expecting a Rotary Foundation District Grant in the amount of \$2500. Also we have a greenway clean-up project planned.



On the International Service front Stacey Guffey reported our club continues to support Project Panama. Sandy Frazier is leading a group of Rotarians on a work mission trip to the school in Panama with supplies for the children in early April. Rotary Foundation chair Jim Garner stated we are in the "final push" to receive donations for this year. We have improved from \$108 average donation per member to \$114 per member. At this time we have received \$8984 and our goal is \$11,000. Membership reported that we are having a successful membership year with an induction scheduled next meeting and several people considering membership.

Program Chair Vic Perry thanked all for providing such great quality programs this year. Public Image Chair Debbie Tallent reported plans are underway for a sign that will have the logos of local participating service clubs to be displayed at a prominent place in Franklin. Flywheel Editor Dick Pritts is still in need of volunteers to help publish the Flywheel. Karen Kenney, Vocational Chair, encouraged members to give a vocational talk. Karen also mentioned that the Read to Me Essay competition was underway and that the students were submitting their essays for judging. Also it is time to nomi-

for over 50% participation in the Rotary 4 Way Test program at the local schools in Franklin. Larry Hollifield mentioned we are needing a host family for the upcoming exchange student program. 



Tell Me This Won't Happen To Us


