POLIO PLUS- INDIA'S INTERNATIONAL IMMUNIZATION DAYS

PDG Dennis Sanders introduced Charles Wolf who talked about his trip to India to immunize children against polio. Charles is a member and past president of the Sylva Rotary Club. He is very active in the district having served on various committees. Charles is not only active in Rotary but serves in various capacities in his community and church. He has been all over the world to include: Bosnia, India, Guatemala, Panama and the State of Georgia. Charles was honored for his work in Rotary by receiving the "Service Above Self Award ", the highest award given by Rotary International with only 150 given each year.

Since 1985 the signature project of Rotary has been the elimination of

polio world wide. After 40 years only 2 countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan, remain where polio still exists. In 2011 India became polio free. Charles wanted to be involved in going to India to help immunize children and knew that going the first of this year would be his only chance since the immunization program was going from oral drops to injections this coming April.



He went to India in February of this year but preparation began several months in advance. Several weeks before going he still needed a visa from the Indian Embassy. With the help of Representative Mark Meadows he was able to go to Washington two days before his flight

overseas and meet with the Embassy Consulate from India. It also helped that Charles wife got him a hotel room right across from the Indian Embassy. While talking with the consulate he asked Charles about Rotary and looking at a picture hanging on the wall of Mother Teresa Charles said, I would like to be a little like her. The consulate immediately granted the visa.

Charles spent nine days in India, along with 30 other Rotarian's from Australia, Canada and the U.S. They met in New Delhi for the kick off of the program. They then traveled by motor caravan to Mewatt, an all Muslim community of about 10,000 people. The first day they immunized at a central location. Once immunized the children's pinky finger were colored purple to show which ones had been immunized. The second day they went door to door and put a form on the door to indicate how many children in that household were immunized. Charles said putting drops in children's mouths wasn't as easy as it looked because the children were scared and they had to force the mouths open on occasion.

He said the living conditions were primitive and people lived with the animals. Contributions by Rotary since it's inception to eradicate polio has been \$1.5 billion. Other donations raised from donor governments is \$6.7 billion. The immunization program is switching from oral vaccine to intravenous injections. There is a current funding gap of \$5.5 million. In 2007 the Gates Foundation contributed \$100 million to help Rotary eradicate polio. In one NID-National Immunization Day 170 to 172 million children were vaccinated.
