Our program was given by Larry Hollifield, our Youth Services Co-Chairperson. Rotary adopted Youth Services and a formal avenue of service in 2010 and gave the work of Rotary serving our youth much broader scope. There are three basic youth organizations sponsored by Rotary at the local club level. Rotaract is designed for young people ages 18-30, Interact operates in the High schools for ages 12 – 18 and Roto Kids operate in the elementary schools for youth 12 and under.

A key part of the Rotary Youth Services is RYLA. RYLA stands for Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. In a camp like setting, youth of high school and college age develop their leadership skills and hopefully learn about the life principals of Rotary. Our club traditionally sponsors two students each year to RYLA. Also another key component is the Youth Exchange Program. This is a study-abroad opportunity for young people who spend anywhere from a few weeks to a full year as an international student hosted by local Rotary clubs. These programs are designed to cultivate our young people into stronger and better adults and

hopefully Rotarians that live out the motto of "Service above Self".

When The Rotary Club of Franklin recognizes the rising freshmen, sophomores, and juniors of Franklin High






