

American Cancer Society Relay for Life

Fellow Rotarian Belinda Petricek introduced Valerie Norton as today's speaker. Valerie is a volunteer with the American Cancer Society and is serving as Macon county's leader for this year's Relay for Life event being held this Friday, June 3rd. This year's event is being held at Macon Middle School. It starts Friday at 5pm with the opening ceremony followed by the luminaries ceremony at dusk. Closing ceremony

will be Saturday at 11:30am. Entertainment is being provided by numerous groups including Blue Ridge and the Franklin High School Chorus. This

year's theme is titled "Paint Your World Purple ".

Relay for Life started in Tacoma, Washington in1985, by Dr. Gordy Klatt. He walked and ran for 24 hours around a track, ultimately raising \$27,000 to help the American Cancer Society fight cancer. In 2015 there were over 6,000 events in the U.S. along with events in 23 countries, including Iraq where troops sponsored an event. Each year over 4 million people come together at these events to help



raise money to fight cancer. Seventy two cents out of every dollar raised goes to fight cancer with only seven cents out of every dollar going for overhead costs.

Since 1991 there has been a 20% decline in cancer death rates. \$3.9 billion has been raised for cancer research since 1946. Money raised has helped fund 47 Nobel prize winners and \$26 million has helped families with free lodging costs. Smoke free laws have also been passed through the work of advocacy groups which have contributed to an overall drop in Lung cancer death rates.

tion items. Ticket chair Tom Coley announced that the horsemen have distributed the tickets to members and if you haven't received yours




please see your horsemen. We have 500 to sell again this
