will graduate with an Associates of Arts or an Associates of Science from Southwestern Community College.


MEC student receive free books and free college classes and credits. There are roughly 16 students per classroom, and there are 160 students currently enrolled at MEC. Administration at Macon Early College works diligently with Macon County



School System and SCC to create a blended schedule for each student. Through a good relationship with FHS and Union High School students can flow in and/or out of MEC at any time during their High School career.

The benefits of attending MEC are numerous. Among them students learn independence, a strong work ethic, attend school on a college campus, save over \$20,000 (calculated savings based on attending two years of SCC and graduating with an AA/AS degree), become engaged in civic service, and still have similar experience as regular high school students through dances, college visits and prom.

Graduation rate at Macon Early College is 100%, and last year 27 students graduated MEC with and Associates degree! If you know a current 8th grade student that may be interested in attending an academic (no drama) focused high school please inform them about the amazing resource we have at MEC. It may not be the program for everyone, but it certainly appeals to many youth in our community!


