Global Scholar

PDG Dennis Sanders introduced today's speaker Halcyon Garrett of Asheville who is our District's global scholar for the year. Dennis stated that most Rotarians know about all the humanitarian projects that the RI grants help but few are aware of the educational part of the Rotary Foundation. The Global Scholar was previously named the Ambassador Scholar.

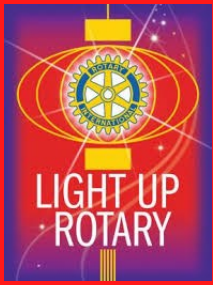


Halcyon stated that she first became in contact with Rotary as an exchange student seven years ago. She said she went to a talk at her high school by an exchange student who had gone to Germany for a year and this intrigued her so in her senior year she applied for and became an exchange student in Italy. Since her return as an exchange student she has returned to Italy seven times. She then attended UNC-Asheville where she majored in mathematics and economics and graduated in 2013. Halcyon says she loves math and the truth that math provides. She saw it as a tool to use data to determine results of programs that address poverty issues that she is interested in.

Halcyon indicated that she was struggling to know what to do with her degree and took time off to determine how she could marry the truth of math with the tools to address poverty and know the results were successful. She decided to pursue graduate school and get a Master of Science in Economics and Social Science after speaking to her host family from Italy and learning of the



Global Scholar program. She will be heading to Italy in two weeks where she will do an internship for the summer at Cometa which is a combination foster home, academics and trade school for about 100 students. Halcyon will then go to graduate school at Bocconi University in Milan for two years, one of the top business schools in Europe. She hopes to show how math can do something helpful for those who do not have many opportunities. Halcyon spoke of how grateful she is for all the opportunities that Rotary has provided and especially for the \$15,000 scholarship per year as a Global Scholar.

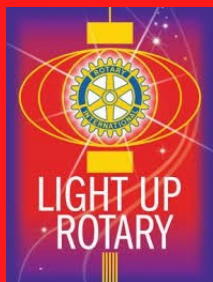
Franklin Rotarians in Brazil!

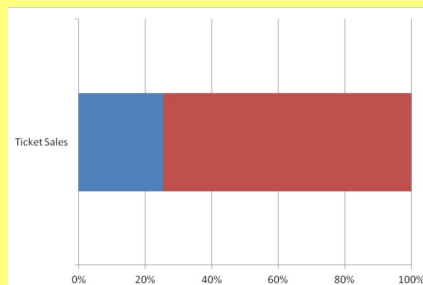

Rickman Fundraiser Underway for 2015!

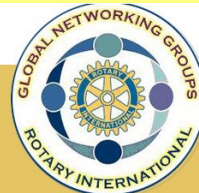

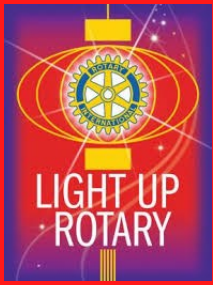

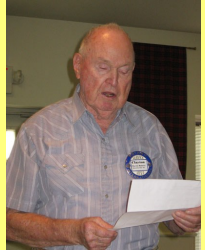

Lexophile

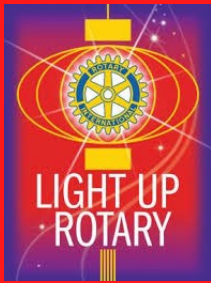


Lexophile is a word used to describe those that have a love for words, such as

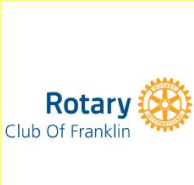

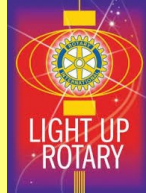
