Distracted Driving



Program chair Vic Perry introduced Trooper Will Vespasian who spoke to the members about the dangers of distracted driving and the role that the Macon County contingent of NC State Troopers are playing in making the public aware that distracted driving has been increasing in the state. Trooper Will reported that this serious problem of distracted driving involves more than just talking on the cell phone and texting. Distracted driving in-

cludes such normal events like changing the radio station, changing a CD, looking at a map or gps guide, dropping something in on the floor or between the seats, talking to a passenger(s) grabbing a drink or doing a "dashboard lunch" on the way to a meeting and other similar movements.




Trooper Will reported some statistics such as 82% of drivers of age 16 -17 have driven while on the cell phone with 34% of them texting and 52% talking. He relayed that these drivers are 2 to 2.3 times more likely to be involved in an accident. Trooper Will indicated that 48% of 12—17 year olds have been on cars where the driver was on the cell phone and that 27% of adults receive or send texts while driving.

Trooper Will reported that we all need to be more aware and diligent and should pull over to take or make calls or text. He said everyone is responsible for safety on the streets and highways. We all need to help family members and others informed about safe driving and the dangers of distracted driving. Trooper Will informed the members that using a cell phone while driving is illegal for those under the

age of eighteen. He said the blue tooth technology helps against distracted driving.

John Short then handed out Certificates of Appreciation from our club to each Trooper of the Macon County contingent of NC State Troopers. Those troopers in attendance were: First Sergeant Chris Wood, Sergeant James Hipp, Troopers Clay Cogdill, Christopher Scerri and Will Vespasian. Rickman Planning Meeting 2015!



Love is in the Air 5K






