
UNC-TV IS CHANGING LIVES FOR THE BETTER

At this week's meeting, Gary Shields introduced Shannon Vickery, Host and Director of Productions at UNC-TV as our program speaker. Shannon has a vast background in broadcast journalism as a news anchor, reporter, an award winning correspondent, and producer. She holds Bachelor's degrees in Journalism and Political Science from the University of Missouri-Columbia and a Master's degree from Duke University. Since coming to UNC-TV in 1995, Shannon has many award winning productions to her credit. A few noteworthy productions include: Reflections for Recovery - which examined the aftermath

of flooding in North Dakota and Minnesota communities; Season of Change - where she followed a "Tar Heel" tobacco family through the challenges of their growing season; and most recently - A Building Crisis -documenting the State of North Carolina's University and Community College Systems.

Shannon shared some interesting trends that indicate that television broadcasting is woven intricately into the fabric of our lives. According to a recent survey of all households in the United States, 97 % have a TV and 84% have at least two TVs. Also, 53% use TV as their primary source for news. The average family has access to over 130 TV channels but watch less than 18 channels regularly. The family watches an average 8 hours of TV per day with children ages 2 to 17 years watching 3.5 hours per day. Internet TV is on the increase with about 20% of those surveyed indicating they watch TV programs online.

Their 2013 budget is \$26.2 million with over 50% coming from foundations and individual supporters. These series show case the outstanding people of North Carolina as well as the incredible beauty and natural resources of the state. 
cently returned from participating in the District 7670 wheelchair project in Southeast Asia.

1936-President Franklin D. Roosevelt dedicates Boulder Dam (now Hoover Dam)..


2001 - Terrorists hijack four airliners for suicide attacks against the U.S.

The significance of this is that when Rotarians go overseas to help inoculate children against polio, each child gets his or her pinky dyed purple so it will be known that that particular child has received the polio vaccine. Money raised from our Interact-Purple Pinky booth at the Fair will go towards our Polio Plus project. You'll be hearing more about Polio Plus in the days and weeks to come from Fred Berger and Demi Bray who are spearheading our Club's Polio Plus project. Thanks to Larry Hollifield, our Youth Service Director, and Susie Ledford, our Club Administrator for putting the booths together and organizing the Interact members to work at the booth. Thanks also to the Club members who have volunteered to work the Interact booth. I hope you'll make it a point to go by each of our booths when you visit the Fair this week.

For those who were not at this week's meeting, the Club passed a resolution suggesting that Immediate Past President Gary Dills be selected as District Governor for Rotary year 2016-17. Gary will be interviewed by a committee of five immediate past presidents from around the District and the immediate past district governor in mid-November, along with nominees from other clubs throughout the district. 

Saturday September 28th— Downtown Clayton—Ramey Blvd.




50 50 Winaah!
