# Read2Me

Parton's "Imagination Library". A short video explained how the program began and its organization.

By PESusie Ledford Rotarian Fred Lindstrom presented our program, Read2Me, and introduced our three guests- Carol Waldroop, Macon County Schools Curriculum Director; Diane Cotton, Literacy Specialist; and Brittany Burns, staff reporter for the Macon County News. The Macon County Read To Me program is partnered with Dolly

Imagination Library, founded by Dolly Parton in 1996, provides free books to children. After families sign up, their newborn will receive the first book and continue to receive one book each month until the child is five years old. The program, which first began in Tennessee has spread to over 1400 communities throughout the country. The organization sends out approxi-

mately 700,000 books per month and has sent out approximately 50 million free books to date.

The philosophy is that children who are read to on a regular basis during the early years will have a far greater success rate in school and throughout life. Carol Waldroop thanked our club for our participation and support and stressed that the Read2Me program is a community effort and counts on the support of civic organizations. She explained that the legislative cuts a few years ago prompted school leaders to look for ways to promote early literacy and that is how Read To Me began. Diane Cotton pointed out important data that supports the program's success. Before Read2Me began in Macon County only 25.3% of kindergarten students were proficient. After Read2Me began that percentage has increased to 52%. Parent training is a big part of the program. The Western North Carolina


Reading Council provides parents with training material and guidelines for successful reading levels of their children. Brittany Burns gave more statistics for the Macon



County Read2me Program. More than 900 children in Macon County have participated in the program, 136 children have graduated from the program (graduation takes place at age 5), and 700 children are now enrolled in our program. More than 4,000 books have been donated by civic organizations, in addition to the Imagination Library books.

Thirty dollars will sponsor one child for one year. Ms. Waldroop announced a Car Show to be held as a fundraiser on April 26, 2014 from 10:00-2:00 at South Macon Elementary. For more information on the Read2Me Program contact Club Champion Karen Kenney.

### Rotary Star for Judy Chapman





### Special Program Announcement

Bill Barr informed the club today about the program coming on March 26th with Iraqi war hero Major Kent G. Solheim. Solheim, a North Carolina native, is a University of Louisville graduate and a Green Beret. He was in Operation Volcano II and the mission was to capture a senior leader of the infamous Shite militia, the Mahdi Army. The high-level insurgent was holed up in Karbala, the large Iraqi city located some 60 mile southwest of Baghdad. Thanks to the then Captain Solheim's selfless and heroic actions in that operation, dozens of American lives were saved. His actions demonstrated how he placed the lives of his men over that of his own, earning him the Silver Star.

For the rest of the story about that operation, which wounded him in his leg and back and the how that injury and subsequent recovery affected his military career. He lost his right leg in the process of recovery from being shot in the left shoulder, one through he left knee and two through his right knee. After two years, which included 29 surgeries, he decided to have the right leg below the impaired knee amputated. Major Solheim will talk about his military service including how he overcame the loss of limb and looks to help other soldiers do the same.

Bill would like to have a full room for this program so members are encouraged to invite friends and spouses who would like to hear this program.

On March 12, 1947, President Harry Truman went before Congress to request \$400 million to help Greece and Turkey resist Communist-led rebels bent on overthrowing their governments. The president laid out a policy that became known as the Truman Doctrine—a pledge that the United States would help nations struggling to resist antidemocratic forces. Truman's words still resonate, and are still important.
