TASTE OF SCOTLAND & CELTIC FESTIVAL

On April 17th, The Rotary Club of Franklin welcomed our guest speaker Doug Morton, event chairman for this year's Taste of Scotland & Celtic Festival. The Taste of Scotland had been a tradition in Franklin for 15 years prior to last year.

The tradition will continue this year June 13th-16th as it starts its 16th year sponsored by the friends of the Scottish and Tartan Museum. Morton, who is from Madisonville, Tn. and of Scottish descent, traces his heritage back to the Douglas clan and is a former airborne ranger.

This year's festival will be a four day event and will be a combination of Scottish and Celtic music. It will start off with a golf tournament followed by a clan gathering that evening. Of course, the event will feature traditional Scottish food provided by Hungry Bear Restaurant. The event will include a beer wagon and a whiskey tasting event. Music will be provided by famous and well known groups such as Jupiter, a Celtic trio and Caledonia Swing. There will also be local




groups providing music throughout the four day event. This year's event will include the best decorated Scottish window for downtown merchants with the public serving as judges. Be sure to be there Friday night because there will be a surprise you'll not want to miss.

The Scottish Tartan Museum in Franklin, N.C. is the only Scottish Museum in the world. The Taste of Scotland tradition is not only known locally but worldwide. This year there will be a blend of Cherokee and Scottish tradition included in the event. The cost to put this event on is between \$12-\$15,000 and \$3,000 has been collected through local donations so far. Groups can show their support for the event by renting a booth for \$50. 


and general clean up.




50/50 INFORMATION


