Money has been provided for a security fence around the school we help in Panama. Other projects include: \$500



Wine and Cheese Orientation



Member Profile-Clayton Ramsey, Family of Rotary...His Story

I was born on a farm in lotla Valley. I attended lotla and Cowee Elementary Schools, Franklin High School, Western Carolina University with a B S degree in Science, and M A degrees in Geography, Geology and Education Administration. I taught at Franklin High School for fifteen years, was principal at lotla Elementary for four years, Assistant Superintendent of Macon County Schools for three years and the first principal of Macon Middle School where I retired with 34 years in Macon County Schools. Since Public Education has never

been acclaimed for high salaries, I raised beef cattle and traded horses for many years. I have also raised commercial peppers and tomatoes, did some surveying and worked as a part time draftsman to supplement the salary. I am very proud of the two Governors Awards that I have received, one from Governor Jim Hunt in 1995 and The Order Of The Long Leaf Pine from Governor Beverly Perdue in 2012. I attended my first three Rotary meetings as a senior in High School in 1942. I had to speak at the third meeting and was terrified. I was inducted into Rotary in 1952, later serving two years as Secretary-Treasurer, as President and as a director in all four areas of service. I also wrote the Flywheel for four years. Rotary has been important to me for over 40 years. The opportunities for service and the fellowship have been a part of my life.



September is Youth Service Month






