
Cheer Medley",

The Rotary Club of Franklin inducts new member





Sgt. Bill's "THIS DAY IN HISTORY"

As of December 31st, this Rotary year is half over! I hope that you've found some real meaning in your Rotary experience so far this year, and that you've been able to volunteer in the area of service that interests you the most. During this time of year when we are made more aware of the importance of giving, I send to you all the words of Bishop Steven Charleston:

"May kindness come to your house, may peace always be able to find you. May strength be there when you need it, may patience ever attend you. May laughter never be far behind the troubles you encounter, nor sorrow stay too long when comfort comes seeking your hand. In every small way may grace enfold your life, the warmth of love sustain you. Receive these blessings now, take them in like old friends found once more, until they become a part of you, a reminder of your own value, of who you are, and what you mean." And may the joy and promise of this Holy Season surround you and those you love.

During World War II, the US military had a policy of racial segregation. Blacks trained and fought in separate units from whites. Before 1941blacks weren't allowed to serve as pilots. Many people said they were not smart or disciplined enough to fly combat aircraft. But that year, under pressure from black leaders and Congress, the Army Air Corps opened an air base in Tuskegee, Alabama to train black airmen.

The Tuskegee Army Air Base trained not only pilots but navigators, bombardiers, mechanics and all the other personnel needed to keep planes in the air. Soon the Tuskegee Airmen were proving they could fly aircraft as well as anyone else.

Beginning in 1943, the Army sent 450 Tuskegee pilots to North Africa and Europe to fight in the war. They flew fighters that escorted bombers over enemy territory. The Tuskegee Airmen painted the tails of their planes red, and as their reputation for protecting planes grew, bomber crews started asking for the "Red Tail Angels" as escorts.

The Tuskegee Airmen flew hundreds of missions and rarely lost a bomber they were assigned to protect. In 1946, after the war was over, training at Tuskegee ended. By then 992 pilots graduated from the program. They had shown the world they could fly with the best, and their superb record paved the way for ending racial discrimination in the military.




