#### READ TO ME

Karen Kenney introduced Diane Cotton, Asst. Principal at Union Academy; Brittany Raby, reporter with Macon News; Carol Waldroop, retired administrative officer with Macon County Schools and Laura Vargas, Read to Me volunteer. Each talked about a different aspect of the Read to Me program and the importance of teaching kids to read early in life.

Diane talked about how Read to Me partnered with Highlands Literacy to implement the Dolly Parton Imagination library which serves all of Macon County. Kindergarten student's, as they entered school, were tested and it revealed that 75.5% were below the reading standard for their

age before Read to Me was introduced into the schools. Since the program has been introduced that percentage has dropped to 48%, a big improvement.





They also have programs through the library for both kids and parents to teach the importance of

Carol talked about Read to Me fundraising activities. This past year they had a car show, which brought in \$1300 through registrations and a yard sale which brought in several hundred dollars. They partnered with several local restaurants which donated a portion of their proceeds to Read to Me. Several grants were received including the WLOS TV Charity Challenge. Upcoming events include a car show on June 6th and yard sale on May 2nd.

Our interact club has raised \$30 which will provide a book a month for one child for a year. For \$30 per year you can provide a child a book a month. If you would like to sponsor a child see Karen Kenney, Gary Dills or Bill McGaha.



#### Make-Ups Needed!


