

ROTARIAN'S HELP WITH FIRST ANNUAL GLEANING

Janet Green updated the club on the gleaning project which Franklin Rotary participated in the first part of October. Gleaning is the act of collecting leftover crops from fields after they have been harvested. This practice dates back to biblical times. Today, gleaning is practiced by groups who distribute the gleaned food to needy families. Students from Franklin High School along with Rotarian's gleaned more than a ton of produce which was donated to CareNet for distribution to needy families. Along with the ton of produce gleaned Mitchell Farms donated over a ton. This brought the total pounds of produce donated to CareNet to over 2 tons.



Janet pointed out that food waste is a big problem with 263 million pounds of food thrown away each day. This doesn't count field crops going to waste. In our country alone 40 million



people struggle with a lack of food. Half of these are children and many elderly. 48 million people live in households where insufficient food is available.
Our country produces enough food to feed everyone but hunger exists because we tolerate it. Food is thrown out because it doesn't meet certain standards. It's color, shape or size doesn't meet specifications.

As individuals we waste a lot of food. To reduce waste in our own homes we can freeze foods and cook as needed, eat leftovers instead of throwing them out. Also look at outdated foods closely, expiration dates don't always

mean the food item is bad.

Becky Williamson, with Farm Service Agency, has been trying to get this program started in Macon County for several years and hopes this will be the start of a yearly partnership with Rotary.

Shaina Adkins, Director of CareNet, also thanked the club and mentioned that many families benefited from this project.

Gary Dills and Gary Shields commended the high school students who helped and were impressed with their enthusiasm, hard work and willingness to give back to the community.
