Shop With A Cop- Showing Kids What True Holiday Spirit Is All About

Our own, Sheriff Robbie Holland gave us an update on the upcoming Shop With A Cop program. Robbie started this program in Macon county approximately 16 years ago After seeing a similar program televised on television. Last year the program served 190 kids who had been referred by local law enforcement officers, schools, community services, fire departments and others in the community. When the program first started Robbie approached Walmart and said if our officers will put in \$25 a piece will you match it. Walmart agreed to match up to \$1,000. The money was then used to take these kids shopping at Walmart and giving them an opportunity to pick out gifts for themselves and having Christmas, which they other wise wouldn't have had.

Since then the program has grown to around \$22,000, which averages around \$100 per child. Law enforcement officers as far away as Burke county come and participate in Shop With A Cop here in Macon county. The biggest supporters of this program are the Rotary clubs of Franklin and Highlands who are helping to make Christmas just a little brighter for these kids.



President Elect Sean Gibson, wearing his new shirt, announced that the new shirts are in and can be picked up at the December 3rd meeting.






Member Profile—Linda Harbuck

Linda is a lifelong resident of Macon County. She grew up in the Otto Community (Tessentee Road) and graduated from Otto Elementary School in 1963 and Franklin High School in 1967. Being only 17 when she graduated she had to wait until she was 18 to get a good job and that job was with Burlington Industries where she worked until the plant closed in the early 70's. Linda bought her first car in 1967, a 1967 Chevelle SS 396, and she still owns that car today. In 1972, she was offered a job as receptionist for the Franklin Area Chamber of Commerce and the rest is history......Linda became the Executive Director of the Franklin Chamber in 1990 where she am currently continues to work. Linda has continued her education through numerous workshops and seminars related to her job as well as many classes at Southwestern Community College. She have served as Secretary and President of the Western North Carolina Chamber of Commerce Executives (37 chambers), and I am still an active member of that organization.

Linda was invited and sponsored by Fred Alexander to join Rotary soon after becoming the Executive Director of the Franklin Chamber of Commerce in 1990. Shewas one of the first women to be inducted into

the Rotary Club of Franklin. Linda served as Secretary of the Franklin Rotary Club for two consecutive years in the early 90's and was honored to serve as the first female President in 1996/97. During her year as President our club sponsored and helped establish the Franklin Daybreak Club. Since then Linda has served on the Rotary board and committees several times, most recently as membership chair last year. Linda says her involvement with Rotary has been a highlight of her life. She believes she has been fortunate to be able to attend two International Conventions (Calgary, Canada and San Antonio, TX). She is also so thankful that she was able to take her Mother with her to Calgary. Her Mother still talks about that experience, saying it was the best trip she has ever been on. Another of Linda's most memorable Rotary experiences was to be able to serve as an escort on our club's last WWII Veterans Honor Air Flight to Washington, DC.

Linda says she loves this community and has devoted herself to service for it. She am Past President of Macon County Habitat for Humanity, Charter Member of our local Toastmasters Club, and a graduate of Leadership Macon 2002 Institute. Linda currently serve as a board member for Macon Transit Service, Smoky Mountain Host, and Southern Highroads Development Organization.
