ABCCM- Helping our Veterans

Jay Lee and Stan Vincent from Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry (ABCCM) were

introduced by Rotarian Gary Dills as today's speakers. They spoke about ABCCM's efforts in helping homeless veterans and veterans on the edge of becoming homeless finding suitable housing or helping them keep from losing their current home. They serve not only Buncombe county but the Western counties of North Carolina.

ABCCM provides homeless shelters for both men and women veterans. To



receive services the veteran must meet one of three requirements: 1. Need to be a veteran, 2. Have an income below poverty level, 3. Be homeless or at risk of being homeless.

Veterans seeking help are first assessed to see what barriers might exist. Supportive services are provided

to help the veteran overcome barriers that might be preventing them from finding gainful employment. ABCCM staff helps them obtain VA benefits and health care. They also assist in coordinating community services that might be needed. Personal financial planning and housing counseling services are provided to help get the veteran on a sound financial course and into suitable housing. Sometimes the veteran just needs temporary help. This is provided

by providing rent assistance, security deposits and opening the pathway to suitable housing. The main goal is helping get these veterans back on their feet financially and helping them get a good paying job they can support their family on. ABCCM works with Community colleges, Job Link centers, VA medical centers and private employers to assist veterans in obtaining career level jobs. Funding for ABCCM programs was cut last year by \$200,000. Over \$192,000 was raised locally to replace those lost funds. Rotary District 7670 has helped by providing \$39,000 with a focus on culinary and hospitality training. Their motto: They Served Our Country Help Us Serve Them



For the Veterans!!

Rotary Districts 7670 (Western NC) and 7570 (Western VA) are pleased to announce Operation Overlord 2014, a new project that entails taking all surviving Normandy invasion campaign veterans (D-day Veterans) living in North Carolina and Virginia to Bedford, Virginia for the 70th Anniversary commemoration. The 70th Anniversary commemoration of D

-day will kick off on Friday, June 6, 2014 at 11am at the National D-day Memorial in Bedford, Virginia. Special commemoration events will be held daily and conclude with a field chapel service on Sunday, June 8. The trip to the memorial is free for all Normandy invasion campaign veterans living in Virginia and North Carolina. Local Rotary Clubs will provide transportation, meals, overnight stays (when applicable), guardians to assist vets, and wheelchairs. A Normandy Invasion Campaign Veteran is defined as any American veteran able to describe in writing his/her participation in the Normandy Campaign (Operation Overlord), from June 6- August 31, 1944 or has documented evidence of receiving an official Normandy Battle Campaign credit. Acceptable participation would include involvement in pre-invasion air strikes; actual landing or air assaults (paratroops and gliders); follow-up reinforcements; off-shore naval support; air cover or air reconnaissance missions; deception operations; and naval, land or aerial logistical support, medical, and resupply operations. Program highlights include an honor guard, recognition of D-day veterans, guest speakers, dignitaries, music, and more. The commemoration begins with a morning ceremony featuring the laying of wreaths by D-day units. Other activities in-* A USO show clude: * Veterans oral history stations

* Reunion Tent * Food vendors * Displays by Living Historians * D-Day Parade Rotary requests the help of the public in identifying these special veterans. 
District Conference Alert
