## Research in the Arctic

Susan Steiner, science teacher at Macon Early College, spoke to members of the Rotary Club of Franklin June 19th. The program was hosted by Robin Jenkins. Susan was one of twelve teachers who applied for and were given the opportunity to study and do research in the arctic through PolarTREC.

Susan graduated from the University of Central Missouri. Upon graduation she worked for Nantahala Outdoor Center. Later she received her teaching degree from Western Carolina University. Her first teaching position was at Macon Middle school where she taught science. She currently teaches science at Macon Early College.


Susan said this research trip to Alaska gave her laboratory hands on experience which she is bringing back to her classroom. The polar region is the fastest warming area of the planet and makes for a unique laboratory setting. To get to the research site the group had to travel from Fairbanks Alaska north for 9 hours on the Dalton Highway, otherwise known as Haul Rd, where you stop for nothing.

Upon arriving at the Toolik Field station, which houses about 150 people in the summer and 8 during the winter, she settled into her temporary home. She stayed in a trailer which had climate control along with a few other conveniences while others stayed in tents. The lab was built on a gravel pad and most buildings were portable. Every effort was made to disturb the area as little as possible. She found out that scientists eat well and said the food was great. They were allowed showers twice a week and laundry once a week. The average water usage was 13 gal. per day compared to 100 gal per day in the U.S.

While at the research facilities she studied tundra soils along with carbon deposits, nitrogen levels, snow melt and ecosystem warming. They had to travel by helicopter to get to the research sites. Once there they walked on a boardwalk to get to the site. Since there was no cell service they had to sign out when they left the center and give an expected time of return so others would know when to start a search in case someone didn't come back on time. Participants kept a journal and a blog while in the arctic so others could follow their experiences. Susan also enjoyed seeing the wildlife while there, including musk ox and fox. All expenses for the trip were paid by Polar-TREC.

This research trip was exciting for both Susan and her students who are able to experience the arctic through Susan's first hand experiences. Susan has been asked by PolarTREC to go again next month to continue her research which she is looking forward to doing.

Tickets continue to come in. Keep it up!




## June is Fellowship Month




