Today's meeting was another great one! We were pleased to induct Amy Manshack into the Club. Amy is one of the State Farm Insurance agents in Franklin. Her dad, Charles Wolfe, who is a past president of the Sylva Club, presented Amy's Rotary pin to her. Amy's sponsor, Sandy Frazier, passed on his Four Way Test coin to her and encouraged her to pass that same coin along when she brings in a new member.

Today's program was on Polio Plus and we were delighted to host Arnold Howell from the Waynesville club as our speaker. Arnold had some entertaining stories to tell us, and during lunch I was pleased to find that he and I both hail from Orlando, and we know some of the same people there. Another "small world" moment! We will continue to pass around the Polio Plus envelope at our meetings during the month of October, and complete our Polio Plus project by the end of the month. The Interact Club at Franklin High School intends to hold a "Purple Pinky" day at the high school one day during the month and charge \$1 each for students to have their pinky painted purple as a sign of supporting the eradication of polio world-wide.

During January our Club will host Dr. Scott Philyaw, History Professor and Director of the Mountain Heritage Center at WCU. Scott will bring us a program on a Polio exhibit that will be at the Center next Spring. That exhibit will center around the polio epidemic that occurred in NC in the 1940's with the hardest hit area of the state being around Hickory, NC.

Rotarian Demi Bray, jewelry-maker extraordinaire, will be making Rotary-themed jewelry this Fall, and just in time for Christmas! Demi will donate all proceeds from the sale of her hand-made jewelry to Polio Plus. You'll get a chance to see some of Demi's creations in the coming weeks at our Club meetings.

Our board meeting will be Monday, Oct. 7th at 5:30 at Life' Bounty Restaurant on Main Street. That restaurant is not usually open in the evening, but Club Administrator Susie Ledford has made a special arrangement with the management to open especially for us. Sandwiches and adult beverages will be available, and board members are encouraged to eat their evening meal there, if possible. Directors and committee chairs are expected to attend, and any Club member is also welcome and will earn a makeup!


On this date October 2nd:


