


The Wilderness Society by Debbie Wallace

Today's program was presented by Jill Gottesmann, Outreach Coordinator for the Wilderness Society's Southeastern Regional Office in Sylva. The Wilderness Society is the leading American conservation organization working to protect our nation's shared wild lands. Founded in 1935, The Wilderness Society's Mission is 'to protect wilderness and inspire Americans to care for our wild places". The Society is committed to the growth of the National Wilderness Preservation system which is responsible for the passage of dozens of bills that have protected millions of acres of wilderness.


The focus of the Sylva office is on wilderness land located in Western North Carolina and Eastern Tennessee. Jill said that 46% of the land in Macon County is federally owned. Between the Pisgah National Forest and the Nantahala National Forest are more than 1.1 million acres. Organizations such as the Smoky Mtn Host, Economic Development and the Franklin Board of Realtors use pictures of our scenic beauty to promote the area.

The wilderness offers numerous activities for outdoor recreation such as hiking, fishing and camping. Outdoor recreation provides more economic value than the auto industry and the pharmaceutical industry. In North Carolina alone, it provides annual revenue of \$19.2 billion, plus 191,000 jobs which equate to \$5.6Billion in wages and salaries. 




50/50 INFORMATION CARDS 13 — POT IS \$0
