

Annual CLUB ASSESSMENT

Thank you to the members who took the time to fill out the Membership Satisfaction survey. Overall, you believe our club is doing an excellent job. However, there are a few things you did not like. Those areas included time for fellowship, meal quality, insufficient member orientation and development and more service opportunities.



The number one concern (9 responses) was the lack of focus on fellowship time. Members see this as a time to get to know other members better and to network. This was a concern both during meeting time and after hours. Lack of involvement of families, which fell under fellowship, was also a concern.

Again, meal quality (5 responses) was another issue with a small minority of the membership. The majority felt the meals were adequate but a few expressed a dissatisfaction with the quality. I feel for the price we're getting great value for our money.

Third, several members (5 responses) felt our new member orientation and development was insufficient. One member suggested including a newsletter page explaining Rotary and our major programs would be helpful. This would help older members as well as new keep up on ongoing projects and programs. The leadership recognizes this and is looking for a volunteer to assist in this effort. Our next New Member orientation is this month.


Fourth, more service opportunities was a concern (4 responses). I think those concerned were speaking of local opportunities and wanted to see the club more involved with local projects the members could participate in. In fact there are many opportunities – four way test projects, Read2Me, Community Care Clinic, the Shadow program, just to name a few. Talk to the Community Service or Vocational Director and volunteer.

Other areas with one to three responses included better speakers and a greater variety of programs. Contributions to service projects and the foundation were believed excessive. Club dues are excessive. Need more emphasis on vocational information.

Several members expressed they would like to be more involved in the areas of member development and education and local and international service projects. The opportunities are there. Individuals just need to jump in and get involved. Just takes individual initiative.

As a whole our club is doing extremely well and members are extremely satisfied with the way things are going. Your inputs are always considered. We are looking for ideas on how to improve meal quality without raising dues — remember the club assembly reviews of club administrative costs.
