

Free Wheelchair Mission

Rotarian Gerry Camelo introduced today's speaker, Jim Hardy from Free Wheelchair Mission. Jim updated the club on Free Wheelchairs efforts to provide and distribute wheelchairs to the poor and disabled around the world. The organization was started by Don Schoendorfer after a vacation to Morocco. A young engineer and inventor, Don saw a disabled woman struggling to drag herself across an intersection, an image he never forgot. He left a successful career in the biomedical field to invent a basic, inexpensive, and durable wheelchair. In 2001 he founded Free Wheelchair Mission, a nonprofit organization which distributes wheelchairs to disabled individuals around the world.



Jim Hardy said that since this organizations beginning they have distributed 700,000 wheelchairs which comes as a Gift Of Hope through A Passion Of Love. Vic Galif from the Cashiers Rotary Club has been instrumental in helping reach this goal. He helped organize the area Rotary clubs, including Franklin Rotary, in raising \$40,000 to send a container of wheelchairs, that's 550 wheelchairs, to Bolivia.

The delivery of these wheelchairs did not go without a few complications along the way. When they first arrived they were held up in customs. When contacted, the group was told they would have to pay \$11,000 to have the wheelchairs released. Not having the money they wondered how they would raise the funds. In a short time the Mayor of Montero paid the money and the chairs were released and finally arrived at their destination. Once the wheelchairs arrived at the distribution site they were assembled, which takes approximately 10 minutes, and were given to the people as they arrived. The team then instructed the recipients on using the chairs and how to properly get in and out of them. The team is also required to keep a record and a brief history of each recipient.



The Generation 2 wheelchair comes in 3 sizes and are adjustable. The cost to build the wheelchair is the same as the first generation, which is \$71.88 per chair. These wheelchairs give the recipients independence as well as the ability to once again support themselves and their families. There are approximately 100 million people worldwide needing wheelchairs. The goal of Free Wheelchair Mission is to deliver 20 million wheelchairs to those in need. 


