Rotary Speaker Joanna Earls from Access Family Services

If you ever had thoughts about being a foster parent, listening to Joanne Earls with Assess Family Services in Sylva (serves all of WNC) would entice you to become a foster parent.

As for the concern that "I couldn't give a child back," she responds, "Look at all the people in your life that you have loved and lost in some way. Do you wish you had never known them?"

Joanna described her path from working as an x-ray technician to working full-time for Access Family Services as a licensing and treatment consultant. She and her husband had decided that their empty 3-bedroom house needed to be shared with children, so they completed the process to become licensed. Since then, they have fostered over 20 children and have now adopted 3 siblings (all girls).

While still working as an x-ray tech, she developed her own business cards about fos-



tering with the "Ask Me About Fostering" line on the card. Eventually she was contacted by the director of AFS and asked to come to work for them. Unfortunately Joanna did not have a bachelor's degree, but that did not stop the process. The director worked to find the grants and funding to send Joanna to WCU and then hired her at graduation.

Joanna's passion for her work is clear: she believes in shared parenting; she still has contact with former foster children; she builds bridges with the biological parent; she does not judge; she simply keeps a child safe until the parent can be reunited with his/her child. Joanna then closed with a call to "Make your family bigger."

- *End of Course scores are up and the school received a grade of a B.
- *The graduation rate is one of the highest in the state at 97%.
- *Students can earn SCC college credit while enrolled at FHS (as well as those enrolled at MEC); FHS students earned 395 credits this year.
- *In addition to the core classes (English, math, science, social studies), there are numerous offerings in other areas such as welding, food services, automotive technology, forensic science, business, and the arts (band and chorus).
- *FHS has a partnership with LBJCCC although there are no students enrolled at the present, but students at LBJ can attend classes at FHS.
- *Mr. Woody concluded his comments with an invitation to "Come and visit FHS."
