YMCA CAMP WATIAA DREAM THAT WILL BECOME A REALITY

Jim Bross introduced Paul Vest, President and CEO of YMCA of Western North Carolina along with Vanessa Scully, Director of Development. Paul and Vanessa made a compelling case as to the need for a summer YMCA Camp that would serve the youth of WNC. Studies show that a majority of the kids attending the various summer camps currently operating in WNC are from a distance of 500 miles or greater. Also the average cost is \$1500 a week per kid with usually a 2 week commitment. These factors of high cost and limited availability are excluding many of the youth in WNC from the summer camp experience.


Thus the dream of Camp Watia was born. Because of the generosity and vision of Ken and Nancy

Glass, a beautiful 130 acre tract in Swain County was secured through a gifted charitable land lease. Then a master plan was conceived to build a summer camp that would fill a niche by serving kids from low to midincome families. Many of these kids have never been exposed to an outdoor wilderness experience or the structured daily routine of camp life. Eating healthy balanced meals, learning arts and crafts, dealing with other kids in a cabin environment are some of the life skills that they hopefully can develop. Also, it is an opportunity to reduce the effect of summer learning loss. On average, a student may lose over the summer, two or more months of grade level equivalency due to lack of stimulation and positive experience.



Camp Watia's target price point for a child would be \$500 per week.

The goal is to initially serve 100 kids per week and grow to 265 kids with a staff of 40. Ground has been broken and construction is underway with a targeted opening by next summer 2016. The completed project is estimated to cost \$5.3 million and to date about \$2.8 million has been raised and another \$500,000 is expected to come in soon. Rich Peoples announced that Franklin High School has requested Rotarian business and professionals members to do a twenty minute talk on your business or profession to the high school students. The talk is to center




around the business / profession, what it takes to get started and how the business / profession helps the community and/ or the world. Rich will have further information and a sign up sheet at a upcoming meeting.



Flywheel Editor Dick Pritts is looking for volunteers to help produce the weekly Flywheel as well as a volunteer to be the main


photographer at our meetings. Dick
