



Women in Rotary

As Rotary clubs continue to promote diversity in their membership, Rotary is marking a milestone. Anne L. Matthews, a Rotarian from South Carolina, USA, began her term on 1 July as the first female vice president of Rotary International.

"Women have contributed significantly to Rotary initiatives, and will continue to do so," says Matthews, who is also the first woman to serve as both a Rotary Foundation trustee and an RI director. "No doubt, the unfortunate and sometimes misleading image of 'an old



boys' club' will be buried for good. "Whether the job is done by a male or female is immaterial," she adds. "What is important is that the individual who serves is effective in that role. With that said, I am extremely proud to be the first woman vice president and am thankful for the California pioneers who pursued membership of women in Rotary." A member of the Rotary Club of Columbia East, Matthews has served Rotary in numerous capacities. In addition to her service as trustee and director, she has been a regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, RI president's representative, lead seminar trainer for the International Assembly, Future Vision Committee member, RI training leader, and district governor. She is a recipient of Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award. Matthews is a Rotary Foundation Benefactor, Bequest Society member, Major Donor, and Paul Harris Society member. Locally several women have served as club president of the Rotary Club of Franklin over the years including Linda Harbuck (the first woman to serve), Cardy White (also served as district secretary), Susan Gibbs, Hank Shuler, Elbie Stiles, Ashley Vinson and current president Nancie Wilson. President-Elect Susie Ledford will serve as club president next year. Several women have also served as club officers in year's past including Fairley Pollock and Patsy Parker for 2013-14. Club president-nominee Sean Gibson was inducted thoughts. Cardy, we miss you, get well into his first Rotary Club in Elberton, Georgia with the first women admitted into that club in 2002.


Keep Cardy in our Prayers

Message From District 7670..Help Needed in the Philippines!.

Bill Biddle, from the Rotary Club of Asheville-Breakfast, has been asked by PDG Frank Dean to accept the responsibility of leading a team to the Philippines to distribute 560 wheelchairs. He is both happy and privileged to do so, but will need four individuals who would like to serve on the team from District 7670, to help distribute these wheelchairs in the Philippines.


The team will leave on Friday, August 23rd, flying Delta airlines from Greenville, SC, around noon and arrive in Manila, Philippines the night of Saturday, August 24th, at 9:25 p.m. (Manila Time). The time allotted for distribution in both districts will be 12 days plus two travel days. Team members should plan on being gone two weeks. Return travel will be Sunday, September 8th, leaving Manila at 6:25 a.m.

Team members will need the following:

- 1 A valid passport, and the passport must be valid for at least 6 months after leaving the Philippines.
- 2 It is a good idea to go to the County Health Department to get any shots that the Health Department would recommend for going into that country.
- 3 Participate in at least one team meeting, to be briefed about the culture in the Philippines, lodging arrangements, customs, travel incountry, etc.
- 4 The Philippines is hot, humid and rainy this time of year. Team members should bring a rain coat with hood.
- 5 Thus far, there is a possibility of incurring lodging expense in Quezon City for 4 nights but Bill is working on that
- and hope to have a commitment that will cover this expense.
- 6 The team will be briefed about what wheelchair assembly is necessary and how to assist in the distribution.


