THE ROTARY INTERACT CLUB OF FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL

"STUDENTS MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN THE WORLD"

Larry Hollifield, chairperson for Youth Services, gave the club an update on the Rotary Interact Club that we sponsor at Franklin High School. The name Interact is derived from the concept of international action. Interact helps young people 12 to 18 years old develop leadership skills, have fun and volunteer in their communities. The first Interact Club, under the sponsorship of Rotary, began in 1962 at Melbourne High School, Melbourne, Florida with 23 students. Since then, Interact has grown to over 250,000 youths in 11,000 clubs worldwide. In order to form an Interact club, you must have the sponsorship of a local Rotary club and school approval with the involvement of a faculty member. Our Interact Club at Franklin High School was started under the leadership of Clayton Ramsey in the late 1960's and later Dennis Sanders made significant contributions to the club's ongoing development.

Some of the notable projects our Interact Club has participated in are; cleaning up of the Greenway and Rotary Pavilion, the Purple Pinky Project, Relay for life, the Pottery Bowl fundraiser, Project Panama, and Read-2-Me where they helped collect and transport over 1500 books.

To be in Interact is to be in the worldwide family of Rotary. Our Interact students are enjoying a program that offers fun, meaningful service activities while providing a chance to develop leadership skills and meet new friends. In turn, Franklin Rotary Club has gained increased support for projects and fresh ideas for service while helping to develop future Rotarians. A good first step to that development process is our Rotary club tries to specifically mention and highlight Interact to our intermediate school students while we are having our 4 Way Test discussions.





Member Profile—Gary Dills—District Governor Nominee 2016-17

Gary is a native of Franklin, NC and currently resides in Otto, NC with Nancilee, his wife. Both are active in the community, serving on various community boards in Franklin and Macon County. The couple has three adult children and six grandchildren scattered along the east coast.

He retired as a Colonel in the United States Air Force with almost thirty years of active duty. He served in various senior command and staff positions at the Pentagon,

European Command, Pacific Air Forces, and several installations around the world. He commanded the 377 Air Base Wing at Kirkland AFB, NM, the 436th Support Group at Dover AFB, Delaware, and Air Forces (Forward) for Operation Uphold Democracy in Haiti. He is the recipient of numerous awards and decorations including the Defense Superior Service Medal, the Legion of Merit with two oak leaf clusters, and the Meritorious Service Medal with four oak leaf clusters. He is a master navigator with over 3000 flying hours in various aircraft.

He began his Rotary journey in 2006 and has served as Club President, District Finance Chair, member of the District Foundation Committee and Council, and District Chair of Operation Renewal which assisted homeless veterans and their families. He is the current District Governor Nominee (2016-17). He was also the principal lead in establishing the Rotary Club of Clay County. Gary is one of the founders and an active member of the READ2ME literacy project in Macon County, and partner in the Dolly Parton Imagination Library serving children from birth to age five.

Colonel Dills holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from Western Carolina University, a Master of Science degree in human relations from Webster University and a Master of Arts degree in Strategic Studies from the Naval War College.






Clayton's Corner


