4 Way Test

Whoever is leading the Four Way Test Program will do a brief introduction, talk to the kids about Rotary and then we go around the room and individually stand up and introduce ourselves. After that, we participate in a small ice breaker with our individual tables.

Once complete, we break into the meat of the program. Each table has a brown bag that has approximately 10 different scenarios in it. Each kid takes a turn pulling a scenario out of the bag and then as a table we discuss what actions should be taken in the situation and how to best apply the Four Way Test in our decision making. Two representatives from each table present their scenario and then the leader of the program thanks everyone for their participation and we close by presenting each student with a Four Way Test Coin!
