NANTAHALA OUTPATIENT CENTER TO OPEN IN MAY


Angel Medical Center is proud to announce the completion of their Nantahala Outpatient Center scheduled to open May 3rd of this year. The program speakers were introduced by Rotarian Gary Shields who also serves as a board member of the Angel Medical Foundation. Vickie Lynn, Director of Outpatient Medicine at the center, said there will be a cancer treatment unit within the center that will have 12 chemo chairs and 2 private rooms. Overlooking the Little Tennessee River on Depot Extension, the Center will allow cancer patients from all over Western North Carolina and Northeast Georgia to come to a convenient location

and receive treatment. She stated that it was the Center's goal to make a sometimes arduous and uncomfortable treatment as palatable as possible by providing attentive personal care to patients and a private room if needed. Vickie highlighted their "Cancer Care Team" that does fundraisers and other types of support for cancer patients in need of financial assistance.

Don Capaforte, Executive Director for the Foundation of Angel Medical Center, cited a recent

study that stated 50% of all males today will develop some type of cancer in their life time. It is projected that 200 new caner patients in this area will need treatment in 2014. The \$2.5 million investment in the new facility is Angel Medical Center's commitment to address this problem. The Foundation is embarking on a campaign to raise \$1million in the local community. Don outlined their naming recognition program whereby areas and equipment of the facility would carry the donor's name in recognition of their gift. One opportunity of note was the brick purchase program with a donor's name engraved on each brick carrying a \$100 donation. Special Program Announcement

Bill Barr informed the club today about the program coming on March 26th with Iraqi war hero Major Kent G. Solheim. Solheim, a North Carolina native, is a University of Louisville graduate and a Green Beret. He was in Operation Volcano II and the mission was to capture a senior leader of the infamous Shite militia, the Mahdi Army. The high-level insurgent was holed up in Karbala, the large Iraqi city located some 60 mile southwest of Baghdad. Thanks to the then Captain Solheim's selfless and heroic actions in that operation, dozens of American lives were saved. His actions demonstrated how he placed the lives of his men over that of his own, earning him the Silver Star.

For the rest of the story about that operation, which wounded him in his leg and back and the how that injury and subsequent recovery affected his military career. He lost his right leg in the process of recovery

how that injury and subsequent recovery affected his military career. He lost his right leg in the process of recovery from being shot in the left shoulder, one through he left knee and two through his right knee. After two years, which included 29 surgeries, he decided to have the right leg below the impaired knee amputated. Major Solheim will talk about his military service including how he overcame the loss of limb and looks to help other soldiers do the same.


The name William Fredrick Cody, born this day in 1846 in Scott County, Iowa, may not ring a bell. But chance are you know Cody's nickname; Buffalo Bill. Cody left home at age eleven, after his father died, and cut a fearless path across the Western frontier. Cowboy, teamster, fur trapper, gold miner, Pony Express rider, Civil War soldier, cavalry scout, Indian fighter. He did it all. He earned his nickname while hunting buffalo to supply meat for railroad work crews. A few years later, when he served as a scout for Army troops fighting Indians, the government awarded him the Congressional Medal of Honor for valor in action.

Buffalo Bill was, in some ways, a man of contradictions. He was an Indian fighter, but also pushed for Indian rights. He hunted buffalo, but later supported their conservation. He loved the frontier, butin promoting it helped it disappear.
