



### **Prosthetics for Life Clinic Seeks Funding to Continue Operations**

Robert Frank, a Certified Prosthetist/Orthotist (CPO), and his wife Kit shared the need for the Prosthetics for Life Clinic located in Ibbarra, Ecuador to obtain funding to continue operations. The program was hosted by John Henning. Robert serves as the Clinical Director and Kit serves as an Adaptive Equipment Specialist for the clinic. They are members of the Asheville Metro Rotary Club and for the last five years, they have been involved in this non profit foundation to provide prosthetic limbs to the poor in Ecuador. Since it began operations, the clinic, known locally as Fundacion Protesis para la Vida, has had a very positive impact on poor inhabitants, mostly children, needing prosthetic care in Ecuador's northern region. Over 1000 prosthetic and orthotic devices have been delivered and 70 pieces of adaptive equipment are in use. The results are that over 500 patients now have the benefits of life changing functionality through prosthetic and orthotic care.






With the support from donors and professional volunteers from around the world, the Franks have assembled a fully equipped facility including fabricating equipment, tools, and prosthetic components for 150 -200 patients. They have a trained local staff of four, including three Prosthetists/orthotists, a secretary and an adaptive equipment technician. All the components were in place for the operation of the clinic. However, as a result of a reorganization of Ecuador's MIES (Ministry of Inclusion), the clinic lost its primary governmental source of funding. Although the clinic has the enthusiastic support and involvement of the recipient families and community, the salaries for the Ecuadorian staff came primarily from this government source. The shortfall amounts to \$33,000 for annual salaries and supplies. Because there is no funding to pay the staff, the clinic has had to temporally close.

The Franks are appealing to local Rotary clubs in District 7670 and Rotary International for support and funding to continue this worthy and humanitarian endeavor. For more information you can visit their website, www.prostheticsforlife.org or contact club international co-director John Henning.



## We Take Plastic!



### Flywheel Lineup for 2013-14


