GOLD STAR TEEN ADVENTURES DEDICATED TO THE CHILDREN OF OUR FALLEN HEROS

Bill Barr began our program by introducing guest Dan and Cheryl Rogers, owners of DuoTech Services, Inc. located in Franklin. Dan then introduced our program speaker, Major Kent Solheim, founder of Gold Star Teen Adventures. Dan shared how he and Cheryl became dear friends with Major Solheim through their volunteer flight missions with the Veterans Airlift Command. Major Solheim began his outstanding 20 year U.S. Army career as an enlisted soldier but soon moved up through the ranks to graduate from Officer


Candidate School and was commissioned as an Armor Second Lieutenant. He then obtained a Master of Education degree from the University of Louisville. Next he completed the Special Forces Qualification Course and served in command positions through six deployments in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. He was severely wounded in Iraq in 2007 resulting in the loss of his right leg. From that near death experience and his two year recovery, Major Solheim was inspired to create Gold Star Teen Adventures.



Gold Star Teen Adventures (GSTA) is a 501 (c) (3) entity that has a mission to provide adventure camps to the surviving youth of Army, Navy, Air Force, and Marine Corps special operations personnel that have lost their lives in the line of duty. Its vision is to enable emotional healing, foster relationships, and develop character and leadership skills. GSTA will strive to achieve these noble goals in 2014 by implementing four major activities consisting of two scuba diving camps, a sailing camp, and an outdoor camp. The outdoor camp will host 15 kids and take place July 18-24th in Franklin under the leadership of Dan and Cheryl. With the help of many volunteers, including Franklin Rotarians, the camp will have a white water rafting adventure, a rock climbing-repelling component, and survival training by Special Forces instructors. The estimated cost of this event is \$29,000. Also, a lot of logistical support from the community is needed to make this event a success.



It is obvious to see Major Solheim's passion as he talks of these kids who have lost a loved one in battle and the emotional person loss he feels about his fallen comrades. He and his volunteers hope to create a relationship of mentoring for these young people, an opportunity for healing, and remembrance of just who their fallen loved were and their heroism and dedication. The Major was very proud to share that 90% of the kids in his program go on to college and many have earned scholarships. We can all thank Major Kent Solheim, a true American hero, for his service to our country and his efforts to make a difference in the lives of these surviving children. 


