The American Cancer Society was formed 100 years ago in their fight against cancer. Last year, cancer related deaths decreased 20 percent since 1991. There were 13.7 million survivors in the U.S. The American Cancer Society follows four steps....1. Stay well in working to prevent cancer with



early detection, 2. Get well with being available with resources and support.3. Find Cures through extensive research and 4. Fight back with community officials and bringing communities together. The American Cancer Society offers workshops and tests to aid in prevention and early detection. They have a 24 hour hotline available to offer resources and support. Both ladies were excited that Cancer Prevention Study 3 was going to be held in Franklin this year and partnering with Angel Medical Center. The study will begin in September.

Relay for Life is held in cities and towns across the country each year. Franklin's event will be held June 8, 2013 at the FHS Track from 10am to 10pm. \$75000 dollars was raised last year from 35 teams and members are encouraged to start a team if you are not already a member. Pres-N Susie recognized the Rotarians who participated in this year's work with the FOUR WAY TEST. She presented each Rotarian with a beautiful pin (see






