Lazy Hiker Brewing Co.

President Susie introduced PN Lenny Jordan, who along with partners Ken Murphy and Tommy Jenkins and numerous local investors, recently opened the Lazy Hiker Brewing Co. in the old Franklin City Hall and Fire House campus. One year ago they committed to renovating the structures to house their craft brewery. Lenny remarked that during their negotiation period with the Town of Franklin the Franklin Press ran a survey asking if a craft brewery was a good business fit for the town. Eighty-three percent of the 474 respondents agreed. Lazy Hiker Brewing committed to investing \$25,000 for correcting the drainage problems with the parking lot and another \$125,000 in renovations to the building. Lenny stated that much more than that was invested in the renovations.



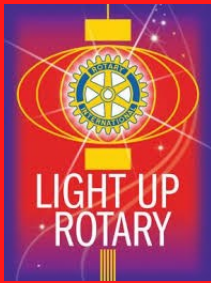
The Lazy Hiker Brewing Co. group wanted to use as much local materials, contractors and vendors as possible in their desire to do as much good for the community as possible. He showed a slide from the west showing the old city hall campus with the downtown and then the mountains to the east. Lenny said the draw of the mountain region and its quality of life is what was the impetus for the brewery and doing a good job of making craft beer that the community could enjoy. They used lumber from an old local post office for the table tops and other local recycled materials for the interiors..

Lenny said that they were delayed in opening by two months due to late deliveries of brewing equipment with the west coast dock strikes. He also indicated that the flooring for the brew house was a special ceramic tile especially for breweries from Germany and the manufacturer sent over two German tile installers to install the floors. They installed a 15-barrel system and two 30-barrel fermentation tanks, and Lenny said the equipment was as expensive as the renovation costs. Noah McIntee is the head brew master, an experienced brewer who has operated 15-barrel systems. Noah is also a Presbyterian minister and has preached at the First Presbyterian Church. Graham Norris, Mike Norris' son is the assistant brew master. Lenny stated that the making of a beer can take a minimum of two weeks up to a year depending on the type you are brewing. The Lazy Hiker will have seven full time employees and seven part time employees.

Lenny indicated they wanted to keep their focus on crafting great beers so they have a food truck to provide food for their customers. He said the chefs of the Fork in the Road food truck are serving great sandwiches and specialties and are keeping with the Lazy Hiker's theme of using as much local products as possible. Lenny indicated that once they get going they will be distributing their craft beer to other outlets in Western North Carolina and indicated that their delivery truck has the local topographic map design on the sides starting with Wayah Bald on one side.



There is a community room in the facility that can be rented for special events. Lenny indicated that they are putting the finishing touches on the bandstand that is located between the main structure and the brew house. They will have live events there once a month after their June 13th grand opening. Lenny said he and his partners are proud of positive impact that the Lazy Hiker has had with local contractors, vendors and the taxes that will be generated for the state and local economy.

Flywheel Volunteers Needed

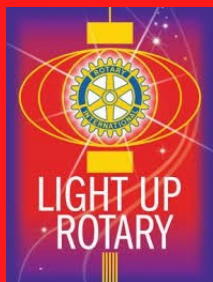

June is designated Rotary Fellowships Month to recognize the im-

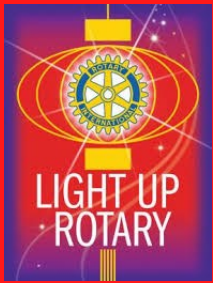

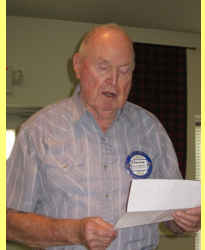

Lexophile

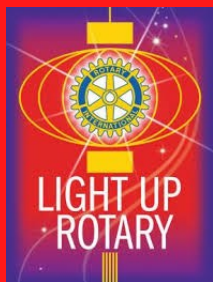


Lexophile is a word used to describe those that have a love for words, such as

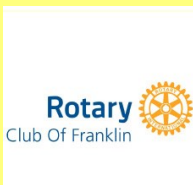

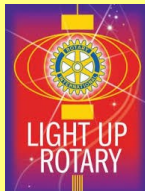
