Rotarian Larry Hollifield presented our program this week with featured speaker Scott Maslin (L), the Macon Middle School Principal. Maslin talked about the results of the Four Way Test program which The Rotary Club of Franklin has conducted the last three years at the school. Scott is impressed with the Club's desire and passion and dedicated work to get the program off the ground and make it work. Not only has the program helped the students improve it has also motivated the teachers to work to-

gether, resulting in steady improvement throughout the school over the last three years.


Scott also noted his favorite part of the program is the Rotarians getting to interact with the students. Many students would otherwise never actually talk to professional and business people. He said the students as well as the teachers and staff needed the program. Building character is the most important aspect. In that light, he shared the story of an event that happened two days after the student killings in Connecticut when a student wrote a note on the wall in a restroom warning of a future shooting at the school. It was late in the school day, but within a short amount of time he was made aware of which student had posted the note from more than one source. He believes that was a direct result of our Four Way Test program at the school.

He strongly appreciated the one-on-one interaction that happens with this program. Scott firmly believes that the school would not have made the gains it has without our program. 
SHADOW PROGRAM NEEDS YOU!


