RI Council on Legislative Overview

The July 31st Rotary Club of Franklin's meeting on the operations of Rotary International's constitution and by-laws was presented by Jim Efland, Past District Governor of District 7670. Jim was our DG in 2004 - 2005 and has been a Rotarian in the Asheville Rotary Club since 1985. He explained that Rotary International was founded as an American service organization 108 years ago in Chicago. Since its founding it has grown internationally and thus is made up of many diverse individuals of many nationalities, religious, ethnic and political make-up so its constitution and by -laws that govern such a diverse organization has survived and thrived over the years.

Jim explained that how RI has been able to continue to grow and meet such a diverse constituency is through the RI Council on Legislative Overview. The constitution, bylaws and Rotary Club operations are reviewed every three years in Chicago with a member from each of the 535 RI Districts. The delegates are supplied over 200 pieces of legislation to be reviewed and the material is translated in six languages. There are headsets for each delegate so that they can follow each member's discussion no matter what language is being spoken.



The Manual for Procedures, By-Laws etc. are updated after each legislative review period. Each district representative has an equal vote to make revisions and this past review period over enactments that change the constitution, by -laws or club rules were reviewed and 50 were approved. Some involved modifications of recent enactments once they had a chance to see whether they worked or not. They can involve simple changes like the club secretary shall be a board member or a club president must be a club member for at least one year. Many of the items reviewed have to do with ways to grow club membership. 



Message From District 7670..Help Needed in the Philippines!.

Bill Biddle, from the Rotary Club of Asheville-Breakfast, has been asked by PDG Frank Dean to accept the responsibility of leading a team to the Philippines to distribute 560 wheelchairs. He is both happy and privileged to do so, but will need four individuals who would like to serve on the team from District 7670, to help distribute these wheelchairs in the Philippines.

The team will leave on Friday, August 23rd, flying Delta airlines from Greenville, SC, around noon and arrive in Manila, Philippines the night of Saturday, August 24th, at 9:25 p.m. (Manila Time). The time allotted for distribution in both districts will be 12 days plus two travel days. Team members should plan on being gone two weeks. Return travel will be Sunday, September 8th, leaving Manila at 6:25 a.m.

Team members will need the following:

1 - A valid passport, and the passport must be valid for at least 6 months after leaving the Philippines.

2 - It is a good idea to go to the County Health Department to get any shots that the Health Department would recommend for going into that country.

3 - Participate in at least one team meeting, to be briefed about the culture in the Philippines, lodging arrangements, customs, travel incountry, etc.

4 - The Philippines is hot, humid and rainy this time of year. Team members should bring a rain coat with hood.

5 - Thus far, there is a possibility of incurring lodging expense in Quezon City for 4 nights but Bill is working on that

and hope to have a commitment that will cover this expense.

6 - The team will be briefed about what wheelchair assembly is necessary and how to assist in the distribution.
