Foundation Update

Foundation chair Jim Garner reported that Rotary is doing good works internationally, nationally and 🍱 locally through various grants and donations. Jim had five members talk about the experiences that they encountered in doing International or local projects. First up was Tom Coley who was involved in the RI project Bridges to Prosperity. Tom stated that the bridges' project was well rounded and had help from multimillion dollar corporations helping to build bridges across streams and rivers in remote areas so that the locals could cross the swollen streams or rivers to get to markets, schools and medical facilities. Tom and his wife Beverly joined several district Rotarians who went to a small village in mountains of Nicaragua and worked with the Rotary Club and the villag-

ers in building the needed bridge.

Everett Stiles talked about his involvement with the District's wheelchair project and the delivery of 572 wheelchairs last August to the Philippines. The team worked with three Rotary Clubs in the Philippines in getting the chairs to those that needed them. While there they were able to attend an installation banquet of one of the club's as Friendship Exchange member. Everett talked about the distinct contrast between the wealthy and the poor.


Past District Governor Dennis Sander spoke on his involvement with the district's program of getting wheelchairs to those in need in Guatemala starting in 2002. They delivered over 200 wheelchairs to the Guatemala City area. Dennis relayed a story about the delay in getting the wheelchairs and how his team helped a older couple get a wheelchair for their 30-year old son who was a polio victim as a child. Dennis has seen first hand how RI through the Foundation can help those in the world without hope.



Karen Kenney discussed her involvement with the local Macon County project of Read 2 Me that has received a District Grant. The Read 2 Me program is in conjunction with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library and has supported getting a book per month until

> five for over 800 Macon County children. She reported that there are about 1400 children in Macon County qualifying for the program and would hope that each of us Rotarians would help sup-🌉 port at least one child at \$30 per year. The Read 2 Me program has an essay contest for students an the winners will present their essay in the Spring.

Judy Chapman, Community Services co-chair, talked about the Community Care Clinic which has been in operation since 2010. It was initially funded by a 3 year Community Health Grant from the State of North Carolina. The Clinic has a 501(c)(3) tax exempt charitable organization and we have supported it with a matching District Grant. It is open Monday nights 5:00-9:00 at MCHD and serves all ages who of the uninsured. The Community Care Clinic relies on donations and grants.
