Satisfaction Survey Update



Rotary Foundation Contributions Due






Dr Boyd reminded us that Christianity, Judaism and Islam all are part of the monotheism of Abraham and share many basic theological beliefs stemming from Hebrew and Greek heritage. Despite the similarities in their heritage, each religion has at one time or another viewed the others as oppressors and themselves as the chosen. In today's world, many Muslims see Christianity and Judaism as hostile to Islam, and vice versa. As Christian and Judaism religious fervor declines around the world, Islam is growing perhaps faster than any of the world's many religions. Islam is currently the second largest religion in the world with over 1.5 billion believers,



He dispelled a prevailing image in the west of all Muslims being Arabs. In fact, 82% of Muslims are not of Arab descent and do not live in the Middle East. Indonesia and Pakistan, for example, have much larger Muslim communities. Islam is also growing fast in Europe (e.g. 10% of France's population is Muslim) and in North America, but is probably the most misunderstood religion in those regions. Dr Boyd postulated the view that most Muslims see the west's war on terror as an extension of the Crusades and a continuing war on Islam. At the same time, the Judo-Christian west views Islam through the terrorist prism and generally labels all Muslims as extremists. In Dr Boyd's view, terrorism is rooted in politics not religion.

As Rotarians, we should think seriously about our views toward differences and let our humanitarianism rule our hearts as we make choices and friends. Seems we listened since Dr Boyd relayed after the meeting, "I hope that our effort today will make a small difference in the direction of world peace. Already one pastor who was present has asked me about leading a seminar at their church."


