

They traveled this past summer and covered over 8,000 miles, starting in Georgia and going thru the Upper Midwest, then thru Western Canada, and then back thru the western part of the U.S. They averaged driving about 250 miles per day and they took over 6,000 pictures, too many to show at our meeting. Their travels took them to some of the most picturesque areas, such as Lake Louise, Banff National Park, Jasper National Park, Glacier

National Park and Calgary, Canada. Included in the presentation were many slides of wild animals and some unique bridges, rocks and even a salt flat in Idaho. Anyone watching this slide show couldn't help but get the bug to do more traveling to this part of our continent.



Volunteer Opportunities


The next 4-way test will be on Friday, January 23rd at Macon Early College at

I don't trip over things, I do random gravity checks!


January is Rotary Awareness Month


