Southwestern Community College

Amy Manshack introduced our speaker, Dr. Don Tomas, President of Southwestern Community College. He was accompanied by Mary Otto-Selzer, Director of the SCC Foundation. Dr. Tomas began his presentation by stressing that "community is the middle name" of Southwestern Community College, explaining that SCC's mission is to provide workforce education to enhance regional economic development.


He was proud to report that SCC is ranked in the top 10 of the 58 North Carolina community colleges. 90% of SCCs graduates remain in the area. Among the offerings are EMT, Fire Science, Basic Law Enforcement, Physical Therapy, Occupational

Therapy, Small Business, and National Park Service Ranger programs. The latter is one of only 13 such programs in the county and draws students from all corners of the US. SCC also offers employers a customized workforce training program for locally-based employees. Dr. Tomas asked that we Rotarians act as advocates for SCC to our elected representatives so that the college can continue to provide quality education to all who seek it.



Macon County has seen a large surge of student growth, with enrollment up 74.4% over the last six years. The Macon public safety campus at the Industrial Park is already overwhelmed and desperately in need of larger facilities. A development plan is in place to expand the Siler Road campus in stages over ten years, with the most immediate need being to provide relief for the law enforcement crowding, as well as adding more classrooms and lab facilities.


PE Susie Ledford announced that members should remember to put the following dates on their calendars:



- 1789 The first inaugural ball, honoring George and Martha Washington, is held in New York City.
- 1915 A German U-boat sinks the British liner Lusitania off the Irish coast, killing 1,200, including a 128 Americans, hastening U.S. entry into World War I.
- 1945 Germany surrenders its forces to Allies in Reims, France, bringing an end to World War II in Europe.
- 1957 John F. Kennedy is awarded the Pulitzer Prize for *Profiles in Courage*.

1992 The Twenty-seventh Amendment, barring Congress from giving itself a midterm pay raise, is ratified.


