



Ginny Williams then addressed the area of enrichment and licensure. Ginny said that there were other enrichment programs such as: Gardening, travel,


professional enrichmeny, fitness and dance, languages, fine and performing arts, photography and writing.

Tiffany outlined the services offered: confidential one on one consulting, business plan development, assist in research for funding sources, loan package development and free seminars on various business topics in the evening. 1260 people received information and had networking exposure this past fiscal year. Tiffany touted three of their programs were successful this past year and would be continued in the future. Those programs included: 1st Annual Craft Artist Business Plan Competition (included 14 people from Macon County), 1st Annual Appalachian Farm School (22 farmers from Macon County) and the collaborative projects with WCU. She posed the question: How can you serve our community through workforce innovation? And followed with: teach a class, take a class, tell others of the programs available, and provide scholarships and funding.



More As I Age A Retired Person's Perspective




- You know that tingly little feeling you get when you really like someone you've just met? That's common sense leaving your body.



Flywheel Volunteers Needed


Flywheel Editor Dick Pritts is looking for volunteers to help produce the weekly Flywheel as well as a volunteer to be the main photog-
