CareNet with Tim Hogsed

Tim Hogsed became CareNet's executive director in March 2018 after 17 years with the Ingles Corporation. He has also fulfilled a calling he received in high school when he received a call to be a pastor at Pine Grove Baptist Church where he claims about 30 young people as part of his extended family.

Hogsed is a lifelong resident of Franklin except for a couple of years he spent in seminary in Pensacola, Florida. After his graduation, he returned to Franklin and settled into married life with Amber. They now have three children, ages 7, 4 and 2—in addition to the 30 church youth. And he is now working to earn a Masters through an online course.

After quoting a passage from Matthew 25:35-40 (now you have to go look it up if you were not at the meeting!), he explained that this Biblical passage is the mission of CareNet's 30 years of serving the homeless, the hungry and the marginalized population in Franklin.

In addition to the BackPack program with which many Rotarians have helped, CareNet has a soup kitchen lunch, which he described as being "like the Sunday meal many would have had after church on Sunday." Last year they served 7835 meals to their clients and the homeless.

The BackPack program will undergo some changes this September. Manna Food Bank will be providing 450 packs/week, so the packing time will be shorter and on a smaller scale. (More information will come in a few weeks.) Last year nearly 18,000 BackPacks were sent home at the end of the school week in Macon County.

Hogsed spoke about the need for volunteers at CareNet—not just back packers but a $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours commitment on any ONE day of the week between 10 am -12:30 pm. Last year the 104 CareNet volunteers logged 10,786 hours which breaks down to 104 hours each/year OR 9 hours/month OR 2-3 hours/week.

Some of the other significant statistics Hogsed shared were as follows:


1 in 3 persons live in food insecure homes

30.6% of children live in insecure food homes

65.2% of Macon County students are eligible for free or reduced lunch

He can account for 70 clients who are homeless.

Hogsed pointed out that many people are living paycheck-to-paycheck and are in debt. About half of these said that their debt was manageable; over half said they were over their heads in debt.
