Update from Sheriff Robby Holland

Sheriff Holland presented a wonderful update to our club this week on the Sheriff Department. The Sheriff's Department is responsible for EMT, EMS and 911 coverage. Recently an individual donated funds to purchase and sustain a Mobile Command Center. Until this donation was made Franklin's Sheriff Department had to request and borrow other county Mobile Command Centers to conduct Safety Trainings within the community.

The Sheriff's Department has created a Citizen's Academy, a Special Response Team, a Investigators Unit, a K-9 Unit, a School Resource Officer Unit, and an in-house fire-arms training school!

Currently the Sheriff's Department receives, on average, 79 calls a day within one 24-hour period. In 2018, the Depart-



ment spent \$160k on vehicle repairs. The Macon Co. Detention Center is a 75 bed facility – Holland stated that "The Detention Center hasn't' seen a day where the facility didn't have all 75 beds occupied" therefore they are having to pay other counties to house inmates. This cost alone was \$300,000 for 2016-2017! Sheriff Holland has done a cost-saving measure by switching food suppliers for The Detention Center – last year the cost was close to \$375,000 – this year the cost will be \$176,000!

Three programs that Sheriff Holland was very proud of are: Operation Think Twice – New Year's Eve safe rides to reduce drinking and driving; Reality Check 101 – Bringing inmates into schools to show the reality of bad choices and how they affect your life; and Prime for Life – a partnership with Appalachian Services that helps inmates to build themselves up for sobriety and positive change once they are released from jail.

Thank you to Sheriff Holland for illuminating all the amazing work you do for our community!


