Jim Garner introduced Josh Brooks, teacher and head football coach at Franklin High, as today's speaker. Josh was raised in a football family and started his football career at Smoky Mountain High as starting quarterback. From there he went on to play for Western Carolina University before starting his coaching career.

Josh has been with the Franklin football program for 20 years starting out as an assistant under head coach Fred Goldsmith. He has been head coach for 13 years accumulating a record of 119 wins and 4 undefeated regular seasons.

He sees coaching as a service and finds it very rewarding. Josh says it's not about wins and losses but about building integrity and character in the individuals. That's what he enjoys most is seeing the growth in maturity among the team members. The players also serve as mentors to students in the high school and are able to pass on life skills they have learned. This year's team numbers 28 which is down from previous highs of close to 100 members.

Josh had nothing but praise for his coaching staff which he said are dedicated beyond anything he has ever seen.

Josh is also the Instructional Mgt. Coordinator, (CTE), which consists of 13 teachers and involves approximately 600 students. This is federally funded and is made up of 6 program areas: marketing, home economics, business, health sciences, agriculture and trade industrial. Students can earn up to a year and a half in college credit. Students take skills exams and state exams and by doing so can become certified in various areas, CNA being just one.

It's good to see educators of high moral and ethical standards such as Josh preparing are young people for the future.

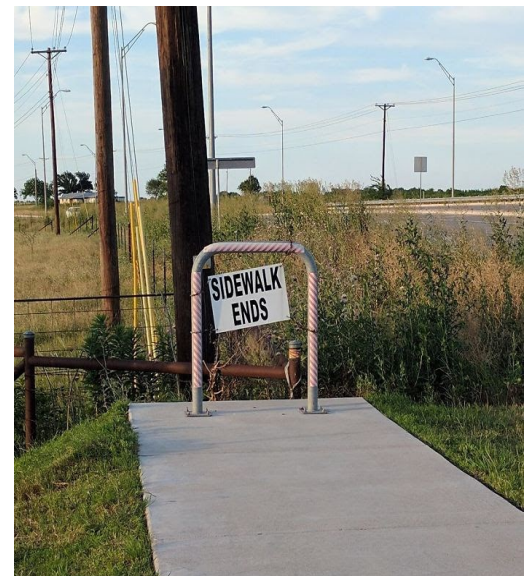
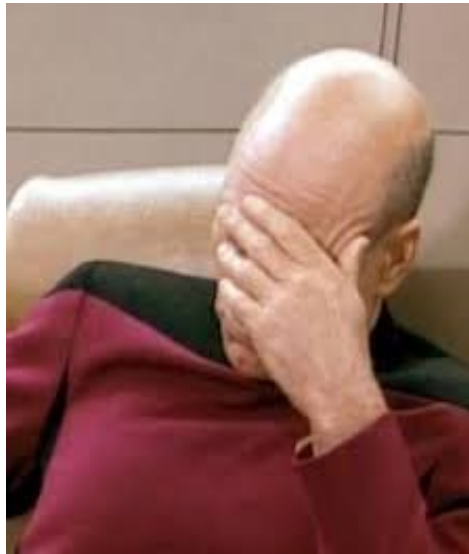
