Bonnie Peggs—

Vial of Life and Healthy Neighbors Network

Bonnie Peggs has been an integral part of the Angel Medical Center team for many, many years now. She has worked diligently to build the communities trust, take care of their hearts, and heal their sorrows all while offering a shoulder and a hug. Bonnie presented two incredible initiatives at AMC that help to assure lifesaving information is obtained by emergency responders during times of crisis, as well as informing us of an amazing new network spearheaded by Bonnie and funded by Mission Health System to take care of those in our communities that are without.

The Vial of Life is a packet of information that is affixed to your refrigerator via a magnet on the back of the plastic casing. The information in the packet will help the Emergency Responders with pertinent information such as: Medications that you are currently on, surgeries and any complications, health complication, and emergency contacts. With the packet comes a sticker to put on your front door or window. ALL Emergency Response teams know to go to your fridge immediately if they see this sticker. These packets can save your life during times of a stressful medical situation. It isn't easy to recite medications, medical conditions, or emergency contacts when you are in a life-threatening scenario, or unconscious.



Next, Bonnie spoke about The Healthy Neighbors Network. The Healthy Neighbors Network is a database system that connects all local, registered churches together so they can communicate and help their community. Many churches are asked to supply help within the community. The Healthy Neighbors Network allows all the churches that are registered to see where the needs in the community are, then fulfill those needs through their congregational support. For example, if someone hears about a family that is in desperate need of clothing, food or basic supplies then a church can choose to support this family – everyone that is registered through the database can see that this need has been met and chose from other needs within

It was wonderful to hear from Bonnie, and to witness all of the amazing things she and her team at Angel Medical Center and Mission are achieving in our community. Bonnie also introduced Rick Van Gilder who will be taking over her role at AMC as she phases into retirement, we look forward to seeing how Rick continues to connect our community together. Thank you Bonnie for all you do, you are a TRUE ROTARIAN at heart!
