KEVINSELLERS MACON COUNTY 911 SERVICES

Kevin Sellers has been working in 911 services for almost 28 years. First in Jackson County where he grew up, and later in Macon County when he moved here full time in 1997.

He began his presentation with a little bit of history about the 911 system which was started in the 1960's by the Federal Communications Commission who worked with AT&T. The first 911 call was made by an Alabama senator in 1968.

Currently, Macon County has eight 911 lines with rollover capability, and over 20 additional administrative phone lines. In addition to 911



requests for medical assistance, they also dispatch for agencies such as the Sheriff's Department, Highlands Police Department, NC Highway Patrol, United States Forest Service, North Carolina Forest Service, Duke Energy, Frontier, and more. In 2018 the department dispatched 37,375 calls. 22,372 of those were 911 calls.

Macon County has three EMS bases located in Franklin, Highlands and Nantahala. Three trucks are always on duty in Franklin, while Nantahala and Highlands have one each for those areas. Macon County EMS also has access to seven helicopter services.

EMS employees go through a lot of training. In addition to their medical training, they are trained in the use of Emergency Medical Dispatch Systems, Instant Command Systems, and CAD (Computer Aided Dispatch) systems, just to name a few. Employees also hold certifications from the SBI and Telecommunications Certificates.

He gave some examples of silly calls they have received over the years, and let us know that during his 27 year tenure, he has delivered two babies.
