HOME DELIVERED MEALS

Mike Watson introduced today's program speakers, Jennifer Hollifield, Administrative Officer, and Deborah Ballew, Nutrition Project Coordinator, with the Macon County Seniors Services office here in Franklin. They provided information about the county's Home Delivered Meals program, which provides a vital service to homebound seniors. Every day, Monday through Friday, they deliver hot lunches prepared by Angel Medical Center to needy seniors in Franklin and Highlands. These meals are delivered by volunteers in their personal vehicles. The meals are also served to seniors (over 60 years old) who are able to get transportation to the Senior Center. These meals are called Congregate Meals because the people are able to participate in other activities while at the center.

About 8,360 hours were donated to this program by volunteers in 2018. Over 18,000 meals were delivered/served to seniors in Macon County in 2018. There are specific state-mandated nutrition requirements for these meals as far as calories and vitamin content. The program is funded jointly by Federal, State and local agencies. The average age of participants is 84. North Carolina was 2nd in the country last year in food insecurity (lack of food). We also learned that in 2019 there are more people living in North Carolina over the age of 60 than those younger than 17.
