# **COMMUNITY CARE CLINIC OF FRANKLIN**

Cathy Stiles, Executive Director of the Community Care Clinic of Franklin, was introduced by former club

president Judy Chapman. Judy said that there are about 30 million people in the United States that are not covered by health insurance. Included in that number are many right here in Macon County. That is why the services of the Community Care Clinic of Franklin are so important. The majority of clinic patients are adults who are employed, but hold jobs where the salaries are not enough for them to afford the cost of health insurance. The clinic serves individuals who are under 150% of the Federal poverty guidelines, but do not qualify for programs such as medicaid.

In addition to serving Macon County residents, the Community Care Clinic provides health care services to many people from neighboring counties who do not have access to healthcare where they live.

The clinic is staffed with a couple of salaried staff but primarily by volunteer doctors, nurses, translators and other community residents. Most of the funding comes from grants, county and town funds and donations from the patients and the greater community. Our club has supported the Community Care Clinic with donations over the last several years. The clinic's annual budget is roughly \$200,000 per year.

The clinic is open on Monday and Wednesdays from 5 to 9 and



operates through a collaborative agreement out of the Macon County Public Health Services clinic. They diagnose and treat acute and chronic illnesses; assist with obtaining medications at reduced or no costs; make referrals for lab and x-ray services; provide education about disease management and prevention; provide behavioral health counseling and provide information on other available services in the community. The clinic has set their services up to be similar to those of any medical clinic and are developing a patient portal system.

Cathy indicated that the clinic is always looking for volunteers and those who also can converse in Spanish are especially in demand. At the end of Cathy's presentation President Janet Greene presented the Community Care Clinic of Franklin, NC the club's latest donation in the amount of \$2,000
