Activities included Alpine Tower, Rock Climb, low rope/team building and several excellent guest speakers. The hope is that when the weekend is over, participants will go back to their communities and connect with other local leaders and also build communication and problem-solving skills.

Gary stated that what each Rotary Club can do is help identify future leaders, through places like schools, church and job sites and then try to get them involved. Rotary

members can also find sponsors, help provide funding sources and volunteer to become mentors. Mentors are expected to stay thru the weekend and help lead the discussion groups. Paul Garner and Kyle Ledford spoke briefly about their great experience at RYLA this past year and how it impacted their lives. Jimmy Villiard also spoke briefly on behalf of his daughter, who attended in 2019 and enjoyed it immensely.

Gary noted that the Interact club (ages 12-18) is going very strong this year at Franklin High School and Janet Greene is starting up a new club at Macon Middle School. He ended his presentation by saying that anyone in the club who is interested in mentoring will get as much out of this experience as the young people attending.
